The big picture

Paul explains the good news of God's righteousness in Jesus Christ. Jew and Gentile alike need grace; justification rests on faith rather than boasting. Christ's death and resurrection open a new life in the Spirit. Paul wrestles with Israel's place in God's purposes before turning to worship expressed through everyday conduct. Mercy takes shape in humility, hospitality, public responsibility, and patient love across differences.
